Class Expectations

- **Positive Participation.** Examples include: good posture, writing in your music, quietly listening, sitting in correct seat, entering/exiting calmly
- Practicing on your instrument is crucial for physical and mental development. Spend at least 3 days, 10 min/day enjoying your instrument (but a little bit every day is best!).
- Do YOUR best. Everyone has their own beginning point

Ahern Middle School Music Concert Attendance Policy

Performance is an integral part of our academic music curriculum. All students are expected to attend and participate in the full-length of every concert that their ensemble is performing in. If your student does not have transportation to/from the concert, contact the ensemble director with as much advance notice as possible. We discourage missing performances due to avoidable conflicts, such as parties, other rehearsals, etc. Please review the entire year's concert calendar in advance to ensure you and your child are available to participate. Please consider this expectation carefully as you agree to participate in any music ensemble.

Concert Attire:

In order to produce a professional appearance, students should wear ALL BLACK for every performance. Examples include long black pants or long black skirt/dress (skirts/dresses must cover the knee while sitting) and tights/leggings, black long-sleeved top (at least 3/4 length sleeves), black dress shoes/socks.
